V. Superintendent's Report – John Scholl

- The committee was informed about the seriously critical condition of the district's fleet of busses. Maintenance is in disarray and about one third of the fleet is waiting for repair or approval. At the last inspection a significant number of busses were in critical violation.
- Chino Valley School District is of one of the plaintiffs in a lawsuit against the State of Arizona for not providing adequate resources to educate kids. The lawsuit will be filed in Superior Court Friday or Monday.
- The Governor has a budget plan and the House has a budget plan and they don't match. Either one has tiny raises for teachers and top performing schools will get more money.
- Insurance. May is open enrollment.

- SEAC can present the new classified evaluation to the Board in the June meeting.
- The process for choosing SEAC members next year will be the same. The principals at the schools will communicate the need and take volunteers.
